Miracles; sayings: before
Twelve chosen (iv. 14-vi. II).
Teachings; miracles: after
Twelve chosen (vi. 12-viii.).
Multiplied operations: the
Twelve sent out (ix. 1-17).

Culminations

Peter’s Confession: Cross
foretold (ix. 18-26).
Jesus transfigured: Cross
foretold (ix. 27-36).
Demoniac son cured: Cross
foretold (ix. 37-50).

The earlier weeks

Messengers sent on: answers,
parables (ix. 51-xi. 12).

Pharisees warned: rebukes,
parables (xi. 13-xii. 12).

Covetous reprov'd: woman
healed (xii. 13-xiii. 21).

Jesus urged away: Lament over
Jerusalem (xiii. 22-35).

The last few days

Galilee: dropsy cured: sayings
(xiv. 1-xvii. 10).

Samaria: lepers cured; sayings
(xvii. 11-xviii. 34).

Jericho: blind: Zacchaeus;
sayings (xviii. 35-xix. 27).

Jerusalem; ascent; Lament over
Jerusalem (xix. 28-44).

4. “THIS IS THE HEIR”– KILL HIM (xix. 45-xxiii.)

Before the arrest

Jesus verses priest, scribe,
Sadducee (xix. 45-xxi. 4).

Jesus foretells the future; Olivet
address (xxi. 5-38).

Last Passover; Gethsemane;
betrayal (xxii. 1-53).

The last few days

Jesus before high priest and
council (xxii. 54-71).

Jesus before Pilate: Herod:
mocked (xxiii. 1-12).

Jesus sentenced, crucified,
buried (xxiii. 13-56).
