The purpose of the Virginia Trip is:

- To assist Legacy Church with an Evangelistic Sports Camp.
- Provide the team opportunity for personal evangelism and community ministry as available.
- The primary focus of the trip will be a **youth mission trip**.
- The dates for the trip are **July 12-20, 2019**.
- The cost of the trip will be APPROXIMATELY **\$350** per team member.
(this amount may be changed due to the # of applicants)
- A **\$100 deposit** is due **with the student's application**.
 - An additional \$125 will be due no later than May 26.
 - The remaining \$125 will be due no later than June 16.
- Each prospective team member must complete an **application to be turned in no later than April 14**.
 - Applicants may be asked to participate in an **interview** with the youth staff.
- There are **only 40 student's spots** available for this trip!
 - Applications will be considered based on when they are submitted.
- All team meetings will be held in the Warehouse (A200).
 - Meetings will be **May 26, June 16, and July 07**.
- Team members will be housed in an area church or retreat center.
- Additional spending money will be needed for shopping, site-seeing, etc

A complete schedule will be available at the first meeting.



WHAT TO BRING

BRING:

ONE suitcase only!!!, one carry-on for the bus
(be sure to pack daily meds, contact case, etc. in carry-on for overnight bus ride)

Clothes for nine days

Sunday—dress/skirt for girls, slacks/nice shirt for guys

Daily—shorts for sports camp & work projects

Toiletries: toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, soap, shampoo, etc.

Snacks for the bus (please only drink containers with resealable lids)

LEAVE:

Weapons (including pocket knives), drugs, alcohol, etc.

TRAVEL ONLY:

Electronics—cell phones, CD/MP3 players, gameboys, etc.
